EDITOR'S VERDICT

Brussels has lost ground as a French-school city; Lycée Français Jean Monnet now carries unusual weight as the last AEFЕ lycee in town. That matters. For francophone families, or for mobile international families who want the French system without compromise, this is the full route from age 3 to 18 in Uccle, under AEFЕ accreditation, with French as the language of instruction and the French Baccalaureate at the core. The real differentiator sits in the exit routes: this is not just a standard French Bac school, but one that pairs that backbone with Bachibac and international diploma options in English or German. In Brussels, that gives it a *rare strategic edge*.

The school's market position is clear. It is a **serious, system-led** day school, not a boutique bilingual experiment and not an Anglo-international hybrid with a French stream bolted on. Parents buying into Jean Monnet are choosing structure, academic continuity and a direct line into the French educational tradition. The average annual day fee is ****€8,808****, which puts it in a strikingly accessible bracket for an international school serving ages 3–18 in Brussels. That price point, combined with its AEFÉ status and all-through age range, makes it **hard to ignore** for families who want a French education without paying the premiums attached to more corporate international schools.

The pupil who fits Jean Monnet is easy to picture. This is for children who will thrive in a French-speaking academic culture, and for families who want clarity rather than curricular improvisation. It suits expatriate French families, binational households, and internationally minded parents who value the French Bac's rigour but want extra linguistic reach through English, German or the Bachibac track. It is **not for families seeking a soft, highly customised pathway** or a school that bends itself around every preference. It belongs on a shortlist because it offers something **increasingly scarce** in Brussels: a full French lycée education, under AEFÉ, in a day-school format, with credible cross-border academic options at the end of the line.

STRENGTHS

- Fully homologated by the French Ministry of National Education, guaranteeing curriculum parity with schools in metropolitan France.
- Part of the AEFÉ global network, easing transfers for French expatriate families moving between countries.
- Offers continuous schooling from early years through Terminale on day-school campuses in Uccle, culminating in the French Baccalaureate.
- Located in Uccle, a well-connected southern suburb of Brussels close to European institutions and the wider French-speaking expat community.
- Baccalaureate award gives direct, recognised access to French universities and classes préparatoires.

TRADE-OFFS

- Instruction is almost entirely in French, offering little accommodation for children without prior French fluency.
- Large overall enrolment across multiple sites can mean less individual attention than at smaller international schools.
- Follows the French national programme closely, giving families less curricular flexibility than an IB or bilingual alternative.
- Administrative processes, communications and the school website are conducted mainly in French, which can be a barrier for non-Francophone parents.

ADMISSIONS

Entry is possible at most levels from maternelle through Terminale, but places in oversubscribed years (notably late primaire and lycee) are limited and often prioritised for French nationals, diplomatic postings, or pupils transferring from other AEFÉ schools. Applications require previous school reports and evidence of adequate French language ability for entry beyond the early years. Waiting lists are common given the school's size and standing within Brussels' French community; families should apply well ahead of the intended start date.
