EDITOR'S VERDICT

Wesgreen International School occupies a distinctive niche in Sharjah: a long-established British day school, founded in 1991, with separate boys’ and girls’ secondary campuses and a clear local pedigree through its founding by Sharjah’s royal family. That combination matters. In a market crowded with generic British-branded schools, Wesgreen has **real institutional roots** in the emirate and a structure that will suit families who want gender-segregated secondary education without leaving the British Cambridge track. It serves ages 3 to 18, teaches in English, and holds BSO accreditation, which gives parents at least one external quality marker. The average annual day fee across the full age range is ****AED 32,961****. That places it firmly in the **value end of the market**, not the luxury tier.

What is special here is not polish or prestige signalling; it is proposition. Wesgreen offers a full British education in Sharjah at a price point that remains accessible to a much wider slice of the market than Dubai’s headline schools. For families who want continuity from early years through sixth form, and who care more about cost control and educational structure than boutique facilities or elite branding, that is a serious advantage. The school’s age span of **3-18** and its foundation year of **1991** matter because they indicate a mature all-through operation rather than a new entrant still assembling its identity. The separate secondary campuses will also appeal to parents with *firm cultural preferences* on adolescence and school environment.

There is, however, a conspicuous problem: the school’s website is not functioning as a school website at all. The listed domain resolves to a sale page, not to any usable school information. That is *a serious communications failure*. For an international parent, a broken public-facing website raises immediate questions about organisation, transparency and admissions handling. It also means the school does not currently publish the basic detail parents expect to verify quickly. Wesgreen still belongs on a shortlist for families seeking an affordable British day school in Sharjah with **BSO** accreditation and a long local history. It belongs there for fit and price, not for digital competence or brand gloss. The right student is one who wants a straightforward British curriculum in English, in a *more traditional* and *less performative* setting than the region’s premium operators.

ADMISSIONS

Wesgreen International School is a co-educational British school in Sharjah for pupils from FS1 to Year 13, so admissions entry points span the early years, primary, secondary and sixth-form stages within its English National Curriculum structure. As part of GEMS Education, it operates on an August-to-July school year, and availability for recent years has been listed as undisclosed on WhichSchoolAdvisor, so families should check current vacancies directly.

Historically the school was described as academically selective, though under GEMS it now serves a broad and diverse community. Annual fees are in the mid-range band, from roughly AED 23,545 to AED 52,180 with an average near AED 33,000.
